Purpose of the Stand Team

The purpose of the stand team is to engage with festival-goers from the stand, to maintain relationships with current supporters and recruit new supporters.

Volunteers in our stand team must be comfortable talking to a variety of people at the event, to share with them our vision and ask for support with confidence. You'll also need to be prepared to be on your feet and willing to work shifts. We promise to make sure you have regular breaks and don't work more than two and a half hours at a time.

Key tasks and responsibilities

Working on the Stand Team

- Proactively engage new and current supporters, as they move past the Tearfund stand, by sharing the latest campaign.
- To encourage and update current supporters about how Tearfund is working across the world.
- Build a rapport so you can ask them to consider supporting Tearfund
- Be an excellent ambassador for Tearfund at all times.

Contributing to the team

- Attend training either in-person or online. As well as a follow up session on site.
- Look out for your own spiritual and wellbeing needs and those of your team around you.
- Attend team prayer time each day. This is a great opportunity to meet together as a team, to support and encourage one another.

- Enthusiastic, confident and outgoing person who wants to communicate Tearfund to the festival-goers.
- Good knowledge of, and enthusiastic about, Tearfund.

- Ability to use initiative.
- Must have a positive attitude.
- Willing to learn and adapt throughout the event.
- Committed to achieving the objectives.

- Meet and work with new people.
- Increase your knowledge of Tearfund and its work.
