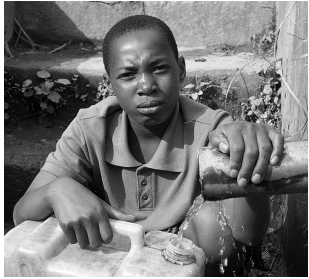


MAKE LIFE FLOW



Tearfund's *Make life flow* campaign is about meeting people's deepest physical and spiritual needs – by campaigning and praying for everyone to have access to clean water and basic sanitation, and giving to the life-saving work of Tearfund partners.

'We treasure the water. It is a gift from God and we value it.' For generations, Stidia's family has trekked down the mountain for water. In her 13 years, Stidia has travelled 13,000 miles. At the spring, she has been beaten, pushed to the back of the queue and intimidated. She constantly feared being raped, and missed a lot of school.

But, the local church in Kigazi village, Uganda – supported by Tearfund – has worked with the community to ensure that every household has access to a pit latrine toilet and is educated about hygiene. More recently, they've started training groups of women to build rain-harvesting water tanks.

With a tank next to her house, Stidia is free from the fear of beatings and able to go to school.
