Transforming communities around the world

Tearfund has been working in Thailand for over 45 years. Today it focuses on supporting faith-based organisations and local churches to respond to the needs of their communities. Church leaders are

encouraged to lead development projects in their communities by making use of local resources, caring for creation and addressing the needs of the most vulnerable.

Addressing local problems, locally

Mrs Wan and her husband, Mr Surat, live in a remote, rural village in the heart of Chiang Mai province, in northern Thailand.

They tried their best to raise their two teenage daughters against the backdrop of poverty. They had very little income, sporadic access to clean water, a shortage of food and no money to pay for their daughters' education. Mr Surat led the small village church, but keeping the men and older boys in the congregation was a struggle. Opium and other drugs were luring them away from their faith, offering escapism from their hardship.

Their village of about 22 families was deeply impoverished. There was little hope among them.

At least, that was, until the Thailand Karen Baptist Convention (TKBC) came to their village and introduced various development initiatives with the community. Supported by Tearfund's only staff member in Thailand, Tui, the Convention had learnt how to assist communities in reducing their levels of poverty, through Tearfund's Transforming Communities programme. Guided by Tui, they showed the community ways to care for their environment and develop their income.

Mrs Wan took part in various activities with women from her village. They learnt about waste management, better farming practices, community micro-financing



groups, water and sanitation issues, and small business management. They also learnt how to advocate with the government about their rights to manage their land and local resources.



Mr Surat also took part in training organised by Tui and the Convention. He learnt how to rear pigs, grow herbs and vegetables, and carry out agroforestry. He trained in shop management and accounting too. This helped him start a new business and diversify the family's income.

Together, the community identified that a lack of water was one of their greatest concerns. And so, Tui arranged for water technicians to visit Mr Surat's village. A team of men from the village were taught how to create dams to maximise the availability of natural spring water from the mountain.

Through this training, Mr Surat learnt how to install pipes which run from the mountain spring to homes in the village. The group also laid pipes to irrigate a new community garden to help feed families in need.

Authentic outreach from the church

As Tui explains, 'Tearfund's Transforming Communities programme in Thailand, and around the world, is significantly impacting poverty reduction. By enabling local churches and communities to collaborate, use their own resources and engage in advocacy, the Transforming Communities programme promotes sustainable development and enhances the quality of life.'

Mr Surat, his wife and the rest of their congregation now have the knowledge they need to help their village to flourish. They understand that by helping their neighbours, they are demonstrating God's love. By caring for their environment, they are able to reap greater harvests. By uniting their voices, they can successfully advocate for local government support. And by sharing resources, they can build small businesses and increase their income.



Supporting a hope-filled future

When local churches learn how to respond to the needs of those around them, amazing changes occur. Hope is restored, damaged relationships are healed, trust grows and the cycle of physical, emotional, mental and spiritual poverty is broken. Churches such as Mr Surat's are already seeing the power of uniting, of using what little they have to grow something far bigger. Now every single person in the village is prospering. Such change is self-perpetuating.

Communities experiencing this kind of transformation will never go back. As the younger generation begin to attend school, hope for a better future takes hold.
