Why we need to pray for the church

A member of Tearfund staff who leads our Transforming Communities work across Southern and East Africa recently had a dream. She was with a group taking candles to light up a dark church. When she got close, people came to attack her with sticks and clubs. They recognised her as the leader and tried to choke her.

As she cried out to Jesus to save her, a man appeared who stretched out long arms to protect her and the group was set free. They went to put the candles around the church and people started to flock to the church from everywhere, especially children.

The staff member woke up with an urgency from God that it is critical to pray for our staff and church partners who are working to mobilise local churches to transform their communities.

Pray without ceasing

Jesus came to bring fullness of life. One of the main ways he does that is through the community of believers, the church. But he also warns us of an enemy whose aim is to 'steal, kill and destroy' his kingdom purposes (John 10:10).

As Jesus' body on the earth, we as the church use our energy and resources to see God's kingdom extended. This includes the energy we and you and the rest of the church invest in prayer. In Ephesians 6, the apostle Paul makes it clear that we are in a spiritual battle. The mission of the church is opposed by evil powers, and so he calls believers to always pray for all God's people. We are excited about the vision God has given us at Tearfund to see 250,000 local churches become transformation centres in their communities. As you join us in prayer today for the church, we believe the purposes of the enemy will be thwarted and that fullness of life will be restored in some of the poorest parts of the world.

Pray with us today for the church to shine brightly

It's not always easy, is it, to shine brightly in ways that can be seen by others? Our natural reaction can often be to try and 'fly under the radar' in life.

God's intention for the church was never to hide away and not be noticed. Instead, Jesus tells us to shine brightly so that those around us can see God's goodness, whether that's in our homes, our workplaces or in our wider community.

Tearfund works through churches and church partners in more than 50 countries around the world, supported by thousands of prayerful people like you.

Our innovative, life-changing community training programme (called Transforming Communities), begins by helping local churches have fresh vision from the Bible about God's role for them, so they can see fullness of life flourish in their community.

God's envisioning

It takes God to open the eyes of his people to see that they can be the light to bring transformation to those around them, which is why we use stories from the Bible as a foundation to the training. We called this part of the process 'envisioning'.

It's a journey on which they begin to imagine a better future, and they see the role of the church in bringing about this future.

'The church realised they had been asleep. The training motivated people and has caused revival in the church. People now understand their own value and also value what they have,' says Naba Lamoussa, Transforming Communities Facilitator, Burkina Faso.

Please pray today for vision for ourselves and for all God's people, so that the church will shine light into darkness across the whole world.

Pray with us today for churches being a safe haven

What is your local church best known for in your community? Maybe the building is a striking landmark or maybe it's a community hub.

For the Casa Blanca community in Nicaragua, their local Rains of Grace Church became known for being a safe haven.

After taking part in Tearfund's Transforming Communities training, Pastor Freddy Roa came to understand the role that the church was able to play in the local area, helping those in need and being a place of refuge.

'I learned that my ministry goes beyond the spoken word,' he says. 'I understand that God demands a lifetime of practical commitment to solving the needs of our community and beyond, that is why our building is available for community service, ready to be used as a safe shelter in time of need.'

Opening the doors

'In 2011, our community suffered a flood and that was the opportunity to serve the community and especially the families who were in great need. Our church was opened to the community not only for worship, but also as a safe haven for those whose houses were flooded. We also managed food aid, house rebuilding and [provided] latrines for the affected families,' he says. 'One of the lessons learned [from the training] has been that, by opening the doors of our building for community service, it has allowed us to strengthen the testimony of the church and we have grown as a congregation.'

Will you praise God today for Pastor Freddy and the Rains of Grace Church? Let's praise God for churches around the world with vision and commitment for their communities.

- more pastors like Freddy engage with Transforming Communities and reach out to their communities.
- the global church will see its call to help people holistically mind, body and spirit.
- God will give us all a spirit of compassion to see the needs in our community and respond by releasing whatever resources we can.

Pray with us today for churches putting prayers into practice

Your prayers are so important to us – that's why we are glad you are using this guide to pray for God's church.

Pastor Parmenas (pictured), from the N10 Lutheran Fellowship Church in a remote part of Chad, is also well aware of the importance of prayer. His church was planted in the area to make it easier for those travelling long distances to attend. But only a few families came along, which led to discouragement and numbers dwindling further.

'We ourselves almost gave in to discouragement, but through prayer, we stayed the course to maintain the balance,' says Pastor Parmenas.

Prayers into practice

Things changed after Pastor Parmenas attended Tearfund's innovative Transforming Communities training and, in turn, trained his small congregation. More and more people became interested in the programme and, as a result of the Bible studies, change began to occur in their lives.

Through the word of God, people realised their skills and resources and used them to put their prayers for their community into practice. Prayer groups blossomed, children remained in school and food was shared ensuring no one went hungry.

The women of the congregation also started a savings scheme, enabling them to generate funds for various projects. And the church continues to grow, meaning more people are able to lift themselves out of poverty.

Pray with us today for unity and peace

During recent elections in Burundi, Tearfund brought together leaders from different churches so they could unite over the role of the church in being peacekeepers where there could be political divide and unrest.

Messages of peace

As a result, 'More than Peace' training was run through their churches and the message spread through communities on the importance of voting and on being a good citizen during the election period.

Training participants shared messages of peace and hope on radio stations run by the churches. And events were organised to pray for election candidates. People remained calm and peaceful during the election.

'I was reminded of the role which must be played by the church in order to maintain peace and security in the community,' says Bishop Pontien Ribakare who attended the workshop. 'From my experience, I have realised that people have trust in churches and their leaders regarding peacebuilding. Messages of church leaders are well received, and when different religious denominations work together for the same cause, their message is really powerful.'

Pray with us today for protection for churches

In August 2023, in the predominantly Christian community in Jaranwala, Faisalabad in Pakistan, an enraged mob of around 6,000 people burnt or vandalised 31 churches and more than 500 Christian houses. The homes of several pastors were destroyed and thousands of Bibles were set on fire.

The attacks started late one night after an act of alleged desecration of the Holy Quran. Fortunately, there were no casualties as people had fled their homes after becoming aware of public speeches by community and faith leaders calling for severe action against the entire Christian community.

Praying for peace

Tearfund responded rapidly and was among the first to reach the impacted communities, helping those in need and organising prayer gatherings for peace.

Christians make up just under two per cent of the population in Pakistan and are often in the lower economic groups in the country. Most of the Christians are living below the poverty line meaning even just surviving is difficult. This makes the Christian population vulnerable to such attacks.

Tearfund works in the area through a network of local church organisations, helping people to join together to address poverty.

'We should not think that opposition or challenges are strange or abnormal,' says Jamshed Gill from our Pakistan team. 'The point here to be understood is how to deal with opposition as a faithful Christian. I'm of the opinion that we should become persons of prayer, walk in humility, keep our hearts compassionate for others, keep following the word of God and trust the Lord.'

Please pray for protection for churches and our staff and partners around the world facing challenges as they work in their communities.

Please pray

O God, we thank you for your faithfulness (Lamentations 3:23).

We ask for your strength and protection for your church across the world, for church leaders and members reaching out to transform their communities, and for Tearfund's staff and partners working to help churches become centres of transformation (2 Thessalonians 3:3).

We pray that you would watch over them (Psalm 121: 5–8) and put your protection around them (Job 1:10).

Be a shield around them and lift the heads of any who are feeling vulnerable (Psalm 3:3).

May they know you, sovereign God, as their refuge and fortress (Psalm 18:2) as they seek to be salt and light in their communities and demonstrate the love of God.

And bless them with peace, we pray (Psalm 29:11).

Pray with us today for churches loving their neighbours

'We use the word of God,' says Rev Josephine Chavaseki from Nairobi, Kenya. 'We have seen transformation as the word of God goes into the community through small groups.'

Josephine is a big fan of Tearfund's Transforming Communities training. As a facilitator of the course, she has worked with many churches in the Nairobi area and has witnessed first-hand the effect it has on individuals and wider communities.

'As a Transforming Communities practitioner, I love participatory work when people discover who they are and have the right perspective... The word of God gives people the enlightenment to understand what God's purpose is for them,' she says. 'Through this we have seen a lot of people discover their divine purpose, their talents, their giftings and their interests.'

Being a good neighbour

As part of the training, participants learn what it means to be a good neighbour and how they can share God's love with others. For the Redeemed Gospel Church in Nairobi, love was put into action when a nearby slum area was demolished, leaving 40,000 of their neighbours homeless.

During this time, the church community came together across approximately 15 churches to provide clothes, food, shoes and blankets to give to those affected. And the church school opened its doors to an extra 100 children who had been left without a school. Josephine says, 'We have been able to achieve this transformation through Bible studies. The power of the word of God. The church is the hope of the world today and the church is transforming the people. Transforming Communities is a powerful tool.'

Please pray

As we pray today, let's also consider our own neighbourhoods:

- Thank God for the ways that the church shows God's love to others in your area and around the world.
- Ask God to identify opportunities for churches locally and globally to show love to their neighbours.
- Pray that God would bless people and churches who sacrificially give time and resources to practically demonstrate God's love to others. Perhaps you can think of someone from your area to pray for who does this, or pray that God will bless the work of the Redeemed Gospel Church in Nairobi.

Pray with us today for mindsets to change

Have you ever discovered that you can do something that you thought you weren't very good at? It's a wonderful, empowering feeling.

One of the most incredible parts of Tearfund's innovative community training is how it changes mindsets so people start to recognise the skills they have and the things they can do.

Created in God's image

In many parts of the world where Tearfund works, people are stuck in a trap of believing that they are poor, worthless, hopeless and will never amount to anything. But the training helps participants see themselves as God sees them – as people created in his image with all sorts of abilities. This frees them to fulfil their God-given potential, which is Tearfund's vision.

Changing mindsets

'The first thing that changes is that we remove from our minds the idea that we are condemned by God to be poor,' says Djerabe Paul, a Transforming Communities training facilitator from Chad.

'Through study of the Bible, we finally realise that what we were thinking about ourselves is not true. At first we think we cannot do anything to change. But once we begin to think about what we can do to improve, we start to use all of the resources God has given us in our own locations to change.'

Please remove any fear from people and replace it with confidence in themselves and in their ability to transform their lives and communities.



Pray with us today for self-belief in communities

Is there a skill or talent that you wish you had but feel that you'd never be able to master?

Our minds, incredible as they are, can sometimes be such a barrier to us achieving things. We can be guilty of telling ourselves that we can't do something or change a situation. Sometimes we really can't, but there are times when it's our mindset that's stopping us.

A church with many challenges

This was the situation for Rev Colette Musabyemariya from Rugote Anglican Parish Church, Rwanda, until Transforming Communities training changed everything.

Colette was sent to lead a church with many challenges in Rugote in 2012. The church building was very run down, there was much poverty, and the congregation was tiny. People didn't think they had anything to offer or that anything would change. Nor did Colette.

Dreaming big dreams

But after attending the facilitator training, Colette realised that she and the church members were surrounded by God-given resources, including the abilities that God had given each of them. Through running the training, Colette gathered people together to dream big dreams and they set about planning. Together, the community have since built a primary school and a meeting hall. They've brought a water supply to the village and many people began income-generating projects. The congregation has increased and their self-belief has grown.

Colette has recently been transferred to minister in another very poor community. But she is happy because she now knows that, with God's help, she can help bring about change.

Praise God today for mindsets changed and lives transformed.

As we come towards the middle of these 30 days of prayer for the church, we want to thank you for your commitment and faithfulness. We know God hears our prayers and acts on them – so you can have confidence you are making such a difference.

Praying for facilitators

Today we are praying for people in the vital role of facilitators in Tearfund's Transforming Communities programme.

The volunteer role of facilitator is at the heart of the process. Often church leaders or church members, facilitators work tirelessly to encourage, influence and persuade people to get involved. They gently encourage everyone to contribute ideas and help the group to embrace their joint projects.

They engage with members of their congregations and community to help them see that they can make life better for themselves, their families and their neighbours if they take part. They model Jesus, ensuring that no one in the community is overlooked.

Motivation for transformation

'Personally, I really feel like helping people who are struggling. And when I am happy I want others to be too. I want to share that happiness... We have to train others, so that others acquire knowledge too... This is what motivated me,' says Madame Kouassi, a Transforming Communities facilitator from Ivory Coast. Tearfund equips facilitators with the knowledge and skills to adapt processes to their own community. They come with the commitment and vision to take their church on a journey of transformation. But we need God to sustain them with his strength through his Spirit so that many people and communities are transformed.

- bless and strengthen facilitators with his power so they can successfully lead churches and communities through the training process.
- help facilitators to be catalysts to transform mindsets, help communities identify their needs and bring community transformation.
- help facilitators to share their passion for transformation with the churches and communities that they are working with. May their passion be infectious and inspire everyone they work with.

And, as we do, trust that more volunteers will be raised up in their communities to lead thousands through life-changing training.

Pray with us today for perseverance

One of the great outcomes of Tearfund's Transforming Communities programme is that it develops self-sufficiency by helping people stabilise or grow their income year on year. And nine out of ten communities who receive our innovative training go on to improve or build facilities like water points, schools and health clinics.*

We've seen some amazing results. But it's not a quick fix. Things don't always go to plan and communities require perseverance to see the fruits of their hard work.

Deflated but persevering

This was the experience of the Pu Dos church in the south of Cambodia. As they began going through the process, changes to facilitators, postponed meetings and tight schedules left participants deflated and unable to see the benefits of the training. But they didn't give up.

The church took time to reflect on why things weren't working out. They also took advice from other churches who had been through the process. And they tried again.

A result at last

This time it all fell into place. The church leaders reported significant changes in the livelihood of both church members and the pastors. Health and relationships in the village improved too.

One of the pastors says, 'We are grateful for the programme and staff who have always been patiently encouraging us to keep the fire burning. We owe this satisfactory result to you. We will keep this fireball burning in our lives and the church forever. Thank you. May God bless you!'

For everyone involved in the Transforming Communities process, pray for:

Pray with us today for places of conflict

There are times when churches are trying to run Transforming Communities training in places where tension and conflict exists, including between people of different faiths. It can add an extra layer of difficulty, especially when the church wants to help impact the wider community. But it can also mean God working in incredible ways.

Today, Isaac Danung, Tearfund's Church and Community Transformation Project Officer in Nigeria, tells us his amazing story of how being a training facilitator saved his and his family's life when conflict broke out between Christians and Muslims in his community.

Warning: some readers may find this story upsetting.

Isaac tells us, 'Out of the crowd of the Muslims that captured me, I heard some people saying, "We remember this man. This is the man that brought us together for community engagement. This is the man who was treating us when we were sick. This is the man that was telling us about how we should live as Christians and Muslims in a very good relationship. Therefore, we should release him to go."

'At that point, surprisingly, we were taken to a very safe place and we ran to a community.

'A few weeks after that, I began [the training] in that same community where I ran to as a displaced person. We began Transforming Communities, we continued with it for seven years where we delivered babies [at our clinic]. It's a very big community of more than ten thousand people. In every household, you could find a baby delivered from the clinic established by the community through the training... Not only that, I made the decision again to go back to the same community where I was almost killed and began the training. It's lovely to go and see what is happening there.

'I wouldn't have been alive to say this story if not because of the gift of Transforming Communities. I want to appreciate God for that. Thank you.'

Pray with us today for peacemakers in communities

In Twic East, South Sudan, years of food insecurity, trauma from war and disease had left people heavily relying on humanitarian aid and without much hope of change. Conflict between communities was adding to the challenging situation.

But in 2020, Tearfund's partner African Inland Church was able to run Transforming Communities training in the region. Through the training, the church was inspired to become a peacemaker in their area.

Bringing peace

As well as learning to make better use of their skills and resources, churches also held peace-building activities. They ran trauma healing sessions and organised peace conferences to resolve local conflicts. Peace Champions were identified and trained from the community, and sports and peace clubs created to aid reconciliation.

'This training has opened our eyes to see the current situation we are in,' says Rev Andrew Thuchkuiir, who participated in the training. 'We don't need to remain in poverty but can mobilise people to discover their God-given potential and the available resources to change our situation and give a better life for our families.'

The training helped local churches to address the needs of their communities and play a pivotal role in restoring broken relationships to bring peace to their community.

Pray with us today for churches to be resilient in times of crisis

Tearfund has been working alongside churches and communities in some parts of the world for many years to help them become more resilient to disasters. In simple terms, resilience is the capacity to cope despite problems and recover quickly.

With an increase in extreme weather due to the climate crisis, these churches play an important part in their community when disaster does hit. And they are being called upon more often.

Hit by hurricanes

In November 2020, Honduras was hit by Hurricane Eta – and two weeks later by Hurricane Iota.

Darwin Hernandez is a Church Youth Leader in the area. 'Since Hurricane Mitch in 1998, we hadn't experienced another hurricane of such magnitude,' he says. 'Now, we have had two hurricanes in less than 20 days. Without doubt this is a warning that something is happening in the world and we have to be aware that we're facing a new reality.

'The church's response was immediate and it was a place of refuge. People literally ran towards the church since we have two two-storey buildings where they could take refuge and wait for flooding to recede. Three meals a day were served for all the people in the community.'

Response and resilience

Tearfund responded to the emergency by distributing food, hygiene kits, tools and other items such as fans and stoves.

And, as part of the Transforming Communities training in the area, churches have identified the

need to be resilient when disaster strikes by being prepared and planning for the worst.

'As a church, we are thinking of sending our young people to training with the Red Cross and our local firefighters, so that they can be first aid responders to provide first aid to people who need it at any time,' says Darwin.

Let's thank God today for churches preparing to be a place of refuge at times of disaster. And let's pray for strength and resilience for churches when storms, disaster or conflict hit.

Pray with us today for people's voices to be heard

How loud would you say your voice is? Do you find it easy or difficult to be heard?

Tearfund's innovative training programmes help communities to stand up and make their voices heard. In fact, our research* shows that, through our bespoke community training, people are 46 per cent more likely to speak up and raise issues with decision makers.

As people going through the training become aware of and start to use the resources they have locally, they also become aware that local authorities have a vital role to play in the development of their community too.

Local churches and denominations are then able to equip their communities to influence the plans, policies and practices of powerful local decision makers and government.

Voices amplified

This process, known as Transforming Communities advocacy, can be particularly useful for local communities who have identified issues that can only be resolved with the intervention of local authorities. Issues like bringing water or electricity to communities, or building health centres.

It also provides an opportunity for communities to amplify their voices – to defend the oppressed and plead the case of those around them – at a national level. And it gives an opportunity for the kind of change that once seemed impossible.

This was the situation for people living along the Tejipió river in Brazil after the river flooded many times due to all the rubbish in it. Pastors from local churches organised a peaceful protest and a petition that gathered nearly 14,000 signatures calling on local authorities to respond to their concerns about the waste and flooding.

As a result of this campaign, the local government allowed community members to participate in public policy consultations and started to take steps to protect the flood-affected communities.

Search for water

Rosalie Mabrao (pictured) is a busy mum to five children. Every day, she would wake up very early and do a 6km round trip in search of clean drinking water for her family. When there wasn't any, they would have to resort to drinking pond or rain water. And in the dry season, even that was sometimes not available. It often made them ill.

After Transforming Communities training was run in Rosalie's village, the community decided that they needed to address the problem of lack of water. They worked together and drilled two boreholes in the village providing clean water to hundreds of families.

Working the land

But that's not all. Thanks to the availability and proximity of water in the village, plus the training she received, Rosalie developed her own market garden and is able to take care of the land around her through climate-resilient farming. And the sale of products from her garden have improved her family's income and diet. Let's thank God today for his creation and for communities able to enjoy what the land can provide.

A difficult decision

For mum of three Zuleima (pictured), the church in Colombia was a lifeline when economic crisis forced her to leave neighbouring Venezuela.

Leaving behind everything you know isn't a decision anyone takes lightly. For Zuleima, it came when she could no longer find food for her three children. Along with more than two million other Venezuelans, Zuleima made the decision to flee to Colombia.

The church changed everything

At first, life wasn't any easier for Zuleima. Job opportunities for migrants and refugees in Colombia were few and far between. Then the coronavirus pandemic hit, and things went from bad to worse.

But the local church changed everything.

'The church opened their doors, and they helped me,' says Zuleima. 'Not only giving me food and a place to live, but also taking care of my emotions, giving me words of hope, giving me words of faith.' As well as providing support for migrants' and refugees' immediate needs, Tearfund's local church partners have been setting up support groups that help people like Zuleima find new income opportunities.

'I am very happy because this has been the answer to my prayers,' Zuleima shares. 'The church has helped to restore my faith and my hope.'

Today, let's pray for churches looking out for the needs of changing and temporary communities.

- that refugees and migrants, including children and young people, continue to find a home in churches, meet with Jesus and be transformed.

Living with a disability

'Let's lift each other as disabled persons' is the name of a self-help group of 15 women and five men from three different churches, all living with disabilities, in Rutunga, Rwanda.

Before Transforming Communities training brought the group together, the members felt they were without a purpose. Many were unable to find accessible work to help them contribute to their household income. Most of them didn't feel valued by society. They felt marginalised and rejected by their community.

Abilities not limitations

'Once we came together,' says Leonille, leader of the group, 'we were able to discover our abilities. Disabilities don't necessarily mean limitations, we complement each other depending on abilities and disabilities.'

Coming together has helped group members achieve a lot, mentally and physically. They feel a new worth and can contribute financially to support their families through making and selling handicrafts. Their feelings of loneliness have also gone, as they meet regularly as a group, pray together and support one another. Just as we reflect on the hope Jesus brings, so the group members are now 'overflowing with hope' that a better future is possible thanks to prayer and local church support.

Pray with us today for churches in communities where beliefs differ

What does it look like to show God's love for others in your community? And what does it look like when the community around us has different beliefs and ways of doing things?

Finding common ground

Differences can sometimes be a barrier. But community action sparked by Tearfund's Transforming Communities programme can help find the common ground between neighbours so God's love can be powerfully shown in very practical ways.

One pastor working with a small church in a predominantly Muslim community in Niger didn't even attend a full Transforming Communities training course, but simply read a few pages of the manual shared by a friend. What he read motivated his small congregation to practise loving their neighbour and caring for God's world.

Starting with a tree

They decided to plant trees in their very dry soil: firstly around the church building and then – at the request of the local Imam – around the local mosque. Church members watered and protected the trees, and volunteered to clean up the streets, collecting discarded plastic bottles and bags and using the waste plastic to make paving blocks

As the local church members sprang into action, the results were seen by the community,

and the benefits were felt by all. Mutual trust and relationships were built which opened new doors for transformation in other areas.

Praise the Lord for love that builds relationships.



So we approach the future both excited and aware of the scale of the task ahead to reach the goal of working with 250,000 churches by 2030. But we also approach the years ahead in confidence that God will be with us and give all of us everything we need to do his will.
