STEP 1: TOUCH BASE AND SHARE YOUR EXPERIENCE

Lots of people have said: "We're all in the same storm, but we're not all in the same boat." We've all experienced this time differently and it's important to recognise that and share those experiences. In your group, spend time answering the questions below. Make sure everyone has the chance to share their thoughts and experience.

- How have you experienced this crisis?
- What have you found hardest?
- Where have you found new joy amidst the crisis?
- What have you learned about the world and your community during this time?

After you've finished discussing all the questions, watch the video below together. It might work for one of you to share your screen, or to share the link to the video with everyone and all watch it before coming back together.

Now you've watched the video, come back together as a group and discuss these final four questions.

- Where have you seen each of these three shifts in society, here or around the world? (greater togetherness, valuing life more than productivity, and a greater imagination)
- What do you hope the 'new normal' for society will be like? What things do you hope change as a result of this time? Locally, nationally and globally?
- What part do you think you and your church can play in reshaping society?
- Finally, considering how we have mobilised as a Church and as nations in recent months, how do you think we could respond to the climate crisis

 the greatest threat to life on earth that we currently know - with the same urgency as this pandemic?

STEP 4: PRAY

After you've finished discussing these - having hopefully got excited about dreaming of a better world and scheming how you might play your part take some time to pray. You can do that all together or pair off and pray on the phone. Pray for people living in poverty at greatest risk from the pandemic, for each other as you adapt to these unprecedented times, and for global leaders as they navigate the way forward.
